- → Ethics Committee- Dr. MI Sahadulla
 - Introduced EPIHC- Ethical Principles in Healthcare.
 - o Targeted & encouraged member hospitals to sign up for EPIHC.
 - o Prepared checklist related to Risk & Disaster Management.
 - Appealed all state chapter presidents to encourage hospitals to sign up for FPIHC.

→ Taxation & Tariff Committee (Dr. Anoop Hajela)

- Submitted suggestions on Taxation & Tariff including reduction on GST on Medical Equipment, AMCs, CMCs and other healthcare services.
- o Raised point of no direct relief from new budget.

- Evaluated various HMIS & Claim Management softwares.

- Formed AHPI Grievance Redressal Committee and resolved most of the grievances received.
- Used digital media to put forward views and received a good response.
- Worked on building consensus around Union Budget.
- o Brought forth posts around Ayushman Bharat.
- Brought out media content around delay in CGHS payments.

- AHPI brought together all the healthcare organizations with common objective of restructuring CGHS scheme.
- AHPI taking up the issue of release of outstanding amount from insurance schemes.

- Plan to pursue revision of CGHS rates.
