Update on Covid by Infectious disease expert -Dr Sanjeev Singh

- 1. Dr Sanjeev highlighted the use of Dexamethasone in India which is included in moderate to severe cases-approved by MOHFW
- 2. He updated on use and efficacy of various antiviral drugs worldwide such as Fevipiravir, Remdesivir etc.
- 3. Dr Sanjeev updated about the inclusion of new symptoms by CDC in Covid cases such as-nausea, running nose and diarrhoea
- 4. He highlighted the recent study of Neutrophil lymphocytes ratio for confirmatory diagnosis for Covid-19
- 5. He supported the CT-CHEST study for investigation tool in diagnosing Covid-19
- 6. Informed about recent developments in Vaccine worldwide

Media Cell

1. Cdr Navneet Bali informed that the proposed PR activity may cost around 3.5 to 4 lakhs per month

WB-Presented by Dr Saumitra Bharadwaj

- 1. Highlighted the problematic points in new ECHS agreement such as increased bank guarantee to 10 lakhs, Reducing admission intimation to 2 hrs, Transfer of patient in case of non-availability of beds and submission of annual audit report to ECHS
- 2. No capping so far on rates in state for treating Covid patients
- 3. PPE capped at Rs 1000 per day and doctors visit at Rs 1000 per day

Maharashtra-Presented by Dr Sujit Chatterjee

- 1. Update on use of Fevipiravir and Remdesivir, Remdesivir found more efficient
- 2. Lauded the Medico legal cell with Law school
- 3. Suggested Membership fee according to beds strength or turnover of hospital

MP-Presented by Dr Anup Hajela

- 1. Situation improving in MP
- 2. Suggested Membership fee of Rs 5000 may not be possible for few hospitals hence other modes of raising funds also to be explored

Karnataka- Presented by Dr Naresh Shetty

- 1. Covid situation in State is now rising
- 2. Govt convened a meeting with Pvt hospitals and medical colleges for reserving beds for Covid
- 3. Highlighted the operational problem of CT if used for diagnosis of Covid due to its infectios nature

Jharkhand-Presented by Dr Jogesh Gambhir

- 1. Health camp conducted under banner of AHPI in Jharkhand, covered by media
- 2. Suggested other mediums to raise funds, as smaller hospitals might find it difficult to contribute, however supported the membership drive to raise more funds

Delhi NCR-Presented by Dr CM Bhagat

- 1. Working to get removed Co morbidity clause from Govt order of Rates capping
- 2. Supported Voluntary contribution from members to AHPI to support its activities for the industry
- 3. Concurred to the idea of Training to media persons about healthcare
- 4. Manpower issue remains in Delhi hospitals
- 5. Antigen antibodies testing helping in developing confidence among workers as workers with active antibodies are more comfortable working in Corona wards

- 1. Suggested more ways to be find out to raise funds
- 2. Few hospitals Reluctant in going to court for matters concerning the industry
- 3. Suggested Life time member fee rather than annual fee
