- 3. RTIs being filed to ascertain the costs of treatment in Govt hospitals and pending amount of schemes
- 4. New changes in MV Act and inclusion of Road Accident Fund, This was initiated by AHPI in the year 2013
- 5. Update on AHPI Books under process on quality, law and climate change
- 6. Letter to PMO written on ESIS pending payments and delays
- 7. Written to IRDA on capping and inclusion of AHPI in the talks
- 8. Star Health on behalf of GIC coordinating with AHPI to set up the rates for Covid treatment
- 9. Committee with IIM and other experts formed for costing study
- 10. AHPI has written to Ministry on MD and DNB allowed to work in Covid hospital and degree may be offered post their 1 year service at Covid Hospital, similarly FMGE students, and Final year Nurses students should also be enrolled to work in Covid hospitals and preference treatment to grant degrees can be given to these.
